## The Classical Conception of Natural Law

An outline of the premodern understanding of natural law according to which each criterion in Aquinas's famous definition is to be resolutely construed as "natural" in an Aristotelian sense — the community is natural (a natural kind), the common good is a natural end, the precepts are formulated naturally, and the authority is natural in the sense of preconventional and pre-political.
