Session 1: Scruton and the Great Tradition

Ferenc Hörcher is a Hungarian political philosopher, poet and historian of ideas. His main research fields include the political philosophy of Conservatism and Liberalism, the history of early modern political and aesthetic thought, as well as the Hungarian constitutional tradition. He was founding professor of the Department of Aesthetics and the Doctoral School in Political Theory of Pázmány Péter Catholic University. He directed the Institute of Philosophy of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. At present, he is head of the Research Institute of Politics and Government of the University of Public Service. He is a published poet, with four volumes of poetry. His last scholarly book is A Political Philosophy of Conservatism (2020).
